Scripture Reading from Acts 2:43-47

Jesus, help us share a taste of hope with our neighbors.

God, be with our neighbors who will receive these quilts. May they be wrapped in love, may they taste your goodness, may they touch signs of your hope. Whether or not we know their names or where they live, they are our neighbors, our brothers and sisters in Christ. We pray all this in the name of Jesus, the One who is our hope.

FIRST READING

Amos 5:6-7, 10-15

And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account.

Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."
